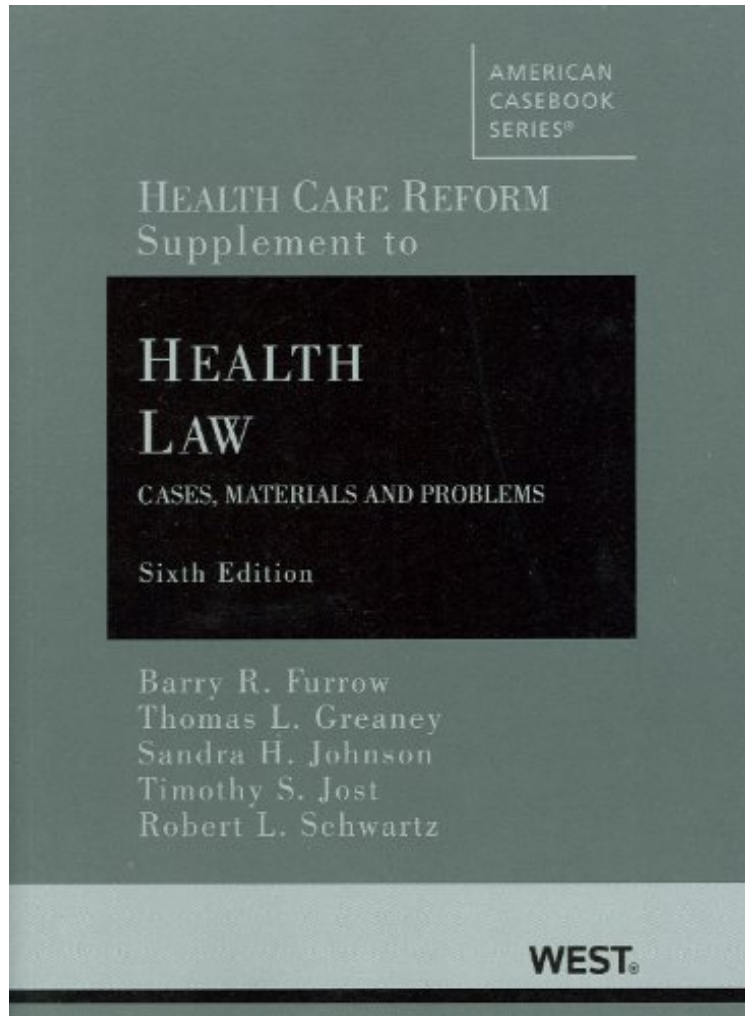

This supplement addresses the very significant changes in health law that will result from the major health reform legislation signed by the President in March. Keyed to the sixth edition of the Furrow Health Law casebook, the leading casebook in this area, the supplement also provides a valuable platform for those teaching health care reform using other materials. It addresses significant changes that result from the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA) and the Health Care and Education Affordability Reconciliation Act (together, the "Health Care Reform legislation"), and it also addresses the consequences of three other pieces of recent federal legislation: the Genetic Information Nondiscrimination Act of 2008 (GINA), the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act (HITECH Act, signed in 2009), and the Fraud Enforcement and Recovery Act of 2009 (FERA).
