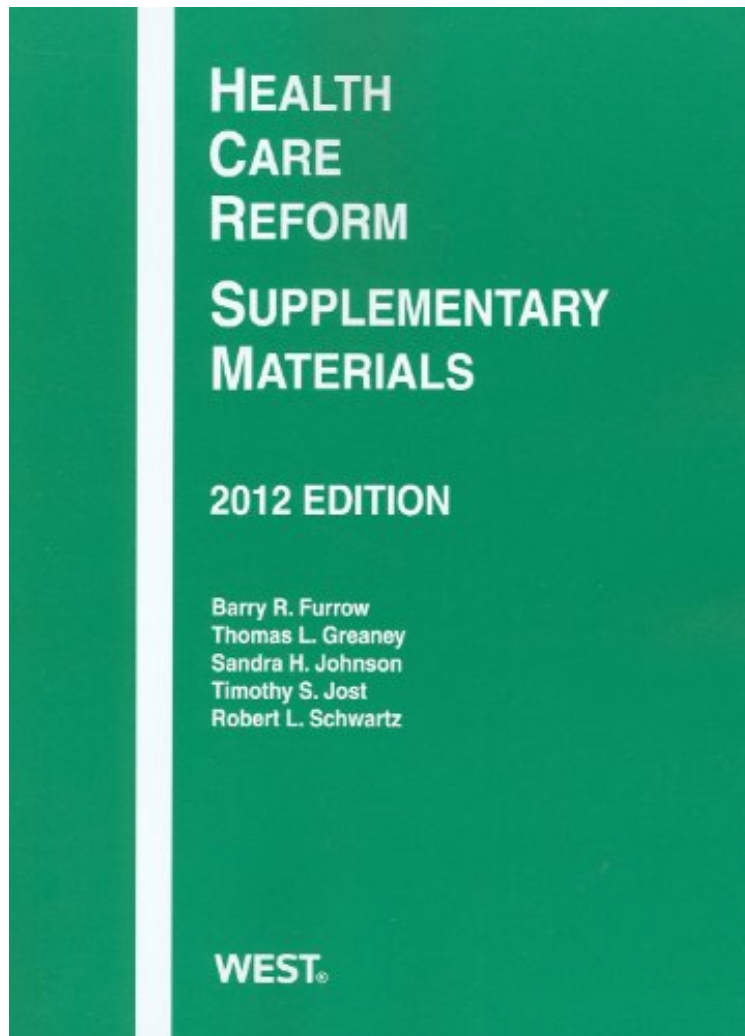

This supplement will feature up to the minute coverage of the forthcoming Supreme Court decision on the Affordable Care Act. Scheduled for publication immediately following the release of the opinions in these cases, the Supplement will include an edited version of the significant opinions and relevant notes designed to help students understand the consequences of the opinions for the development of the health care system and health law in the United States. Notes and comments on the effects of the Affordable Care Act and the litigation on issues treated in the casebook will be included throughout the text.
