This book seemed to me to be more of an infomercial than a source of reliable information. He pushes one thing too hard, on a single approach, to the virtual exclusion of all else - and that one thing happens to be a product he licenses. His examples are like the examples in TV commercial. Extreme, overdone and a 100% one sided. Can not recommend.
