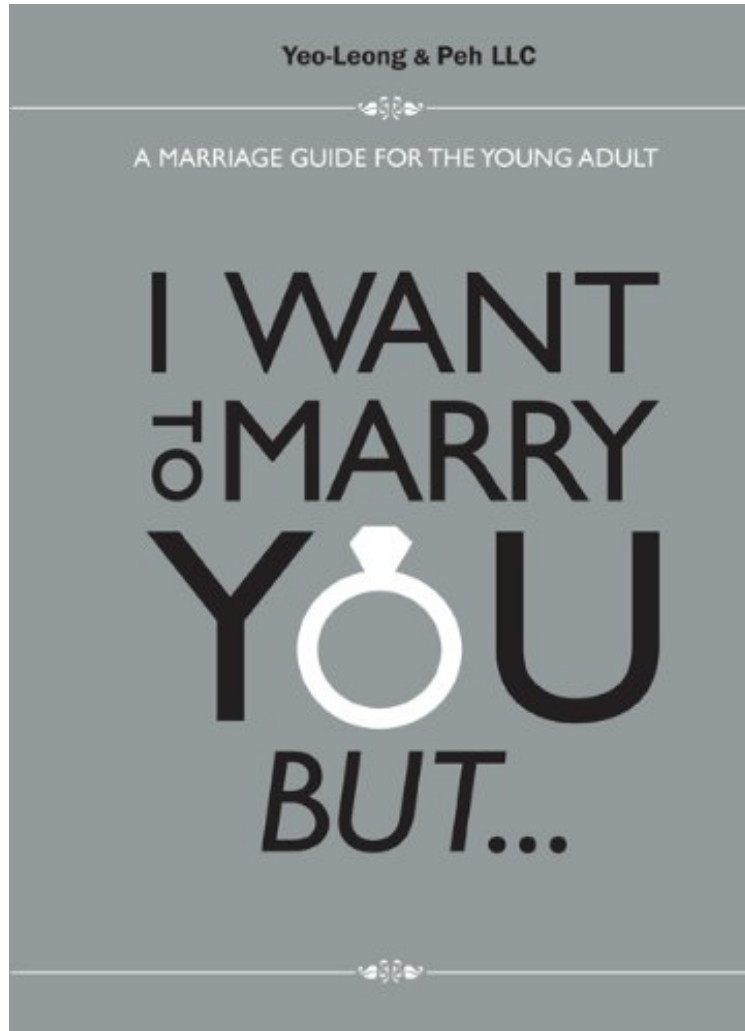

She is the founder and Chairman of VIVA Foundation for Children with Cancer, an institution of public character and charity established in Singapore in 2005 to raise the cure rate of children with cancer in Singapore and the region. She is also founder Chairman of VIVA China Children's Cancer Foundation Ltd set up in 2014, a charity in HK committed to raise the cure rate of childhood cancer in China Hong Kong. She served as a member of the Board of Governors, Raffles Girls' Secondary School for more than 10 years, chaired the South Asia chapter of the Urban Land Institute, and served as the director of the Assisi Hospice for a few years. She is literate in English and Malay and can speak some Mandarin and Chinese dialects. She enjoys travelling and music. She is Licentiate of the Royal Schools of Music in Piano Performing (1975) and in Teaching (1978). She won the Phillips Award (First Prize Open Section) of the Singapore Musical Society's Annual Piano Competition in 1977.
