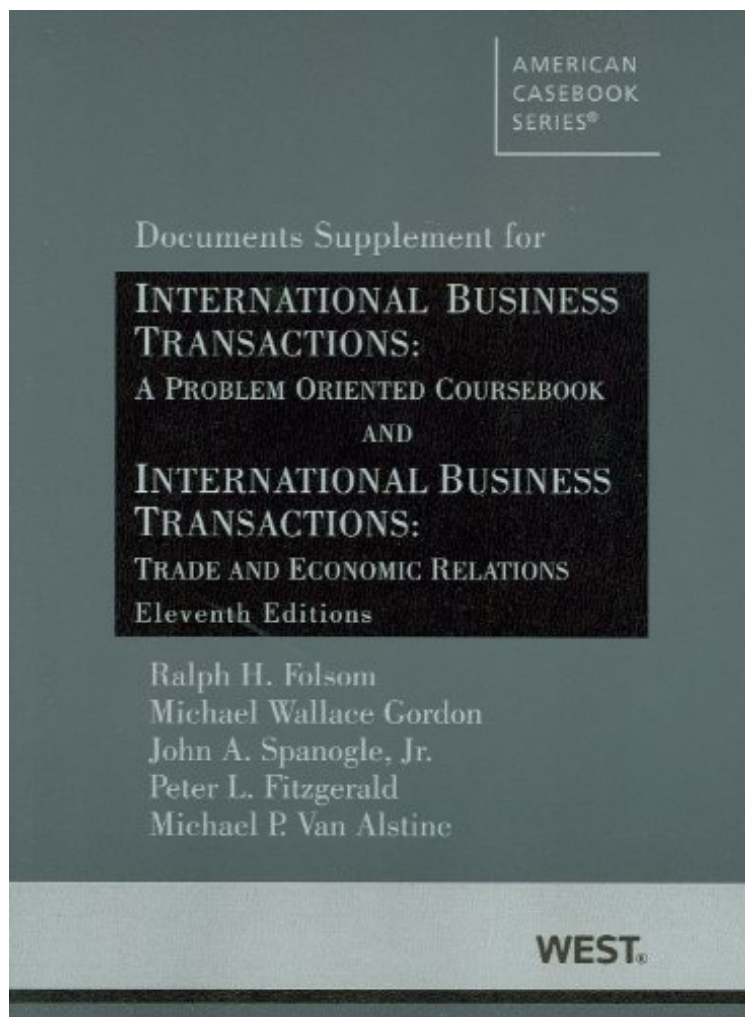

Part of my lack of interest stemmed from the professor's style, though part was also from the absurdly boring nature of the readings. That said, I'm guessing that you're here because this is required for a course too - I can't imagine many buy this for a Christmas present or a casual beach reading. So in terms of content it hits the mark more or less - covers many of the important legal aspect of international business and is pretty thorough while doing so. But I really struggled to keep attention during the reading, I really thought it was overly dry and unnecessarily boring. I noticed a couple small errors but nothing really awful that the other reviewer mentioned. There's also a roughly 800 page "Documents Supplement" that goes along with this, as if this 1000 page behemoth wasn't enough. If you're looking to save a few bucks on the absurd price of the text, check out older editions. They have a couple chapters omitted and the page numbers will be off, but they can be bought for pennies on the dollar or simply checked out from your library.1 of 2 people found the following review helpful. Why oh why oh whyBy C. MorrisFull of typos. Typos everywhere. I guess I'm getting used to that in the casebooks for my upper-level law classes, but ugh. The worst part was the lack of continuity. Like sections that would say that there are 3 reasons why X, and then list 5 reasons. Or say that there are 5 reasons why Y, and then list 4, making you wonder if you missed something. The excerpts are edited sloppily, leading to sections that read similar to "Even though I like cheese . . . I think cheese is the best thing on earth." Except of course it's not as simple as a discourse on liking cheese, making you read again and again and again to see where you and your understanding of grammar got lost. It was very frustrating to not know what I wasn't understanding because the stuff was dense material and what I wasn't understanding because the book contradicted itself. There was also very little explanatory material; the book was mainly a collection of articles on various topics. I feel as if my professor could have just given me a list of citations and I would have been just as well off, maybe better, with the same material and \$150+ still in my pocket. It really sucks that these books get assigned and there's nothing students can really do about it.
