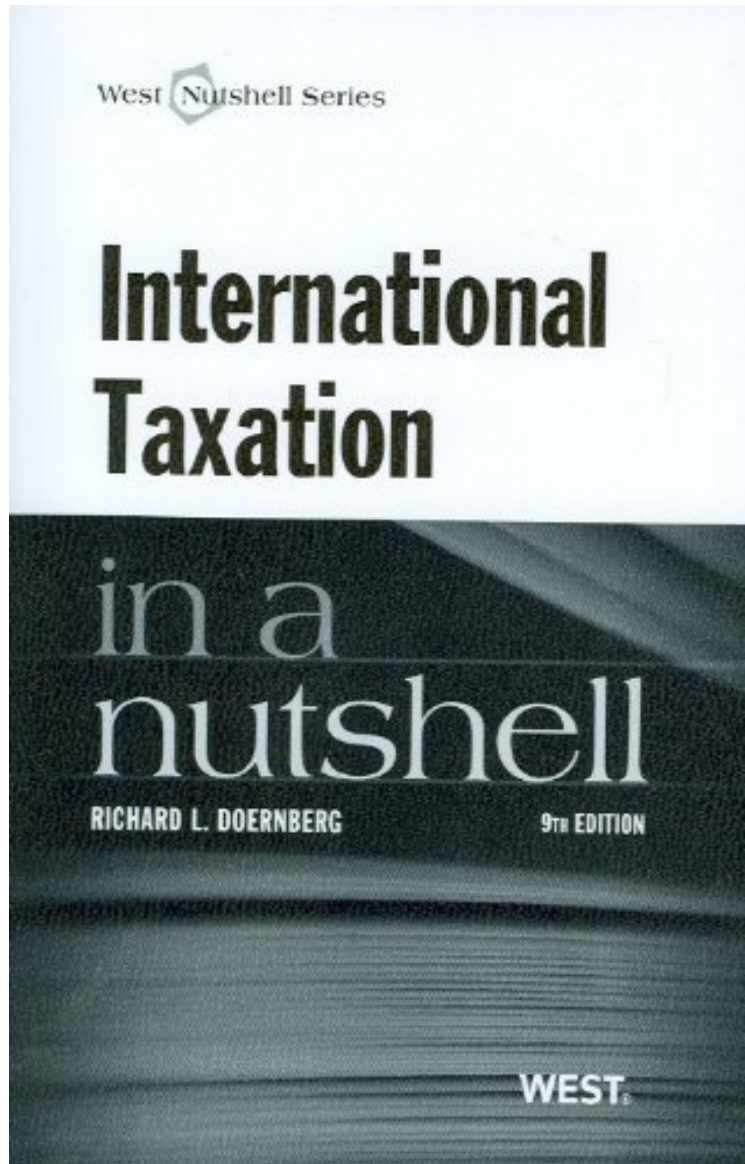

I am normally not a fan of the Nutshell series because they tend to say too-little about the subject to be useful and the organization of the topics tends to be somewhat disjointed, but I quite enjoyed this volume. I am taking International Taxation with Professor Steines at New York University School of Law, and read this over the summer as a quick introduction to get my bearings. The topics are well-organized, and are concise without being too curt. You can read the book straight through, or just read the chapters as you need them.
Professor Steines, I should note, recommended this volume as a "good explanation of very basic principles." For a slightly more advanced introduction to the material, Professor Steines recommended Lawrence Lokken's "Fundamentals of International Taxation." He also spoke highly of Joseph Eisenberg's book on the subject, published by Foundation Press.
