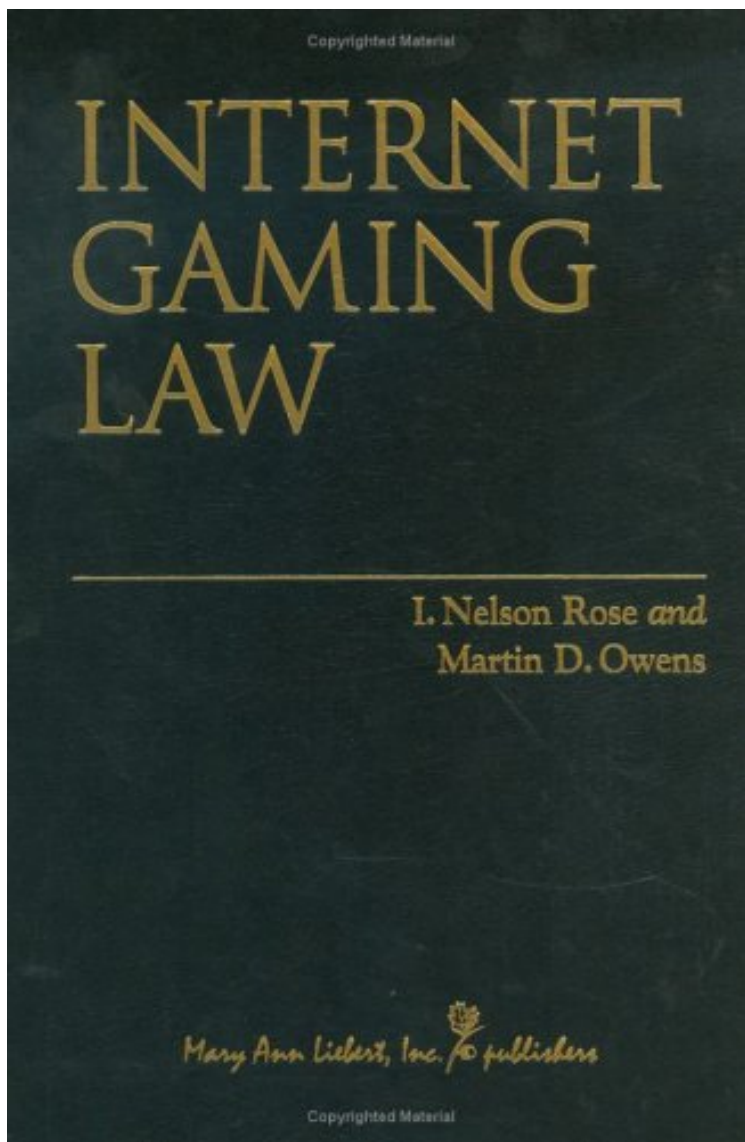

A graduate of Harvard Law School ('79), he is a tenured full Professor of Law at Whittier Law School in Costa Mesa, California, where he teaches one of the first law school classes on gambling and the law. Martin Owens graduated from McGeorge Law School in California in 1994 and has specialized in Internet gaming law since 1998. He is the author of numerous articles on gaming law and has recently been a guest speaker at the Global Gaming Expo in Las Vegas.
