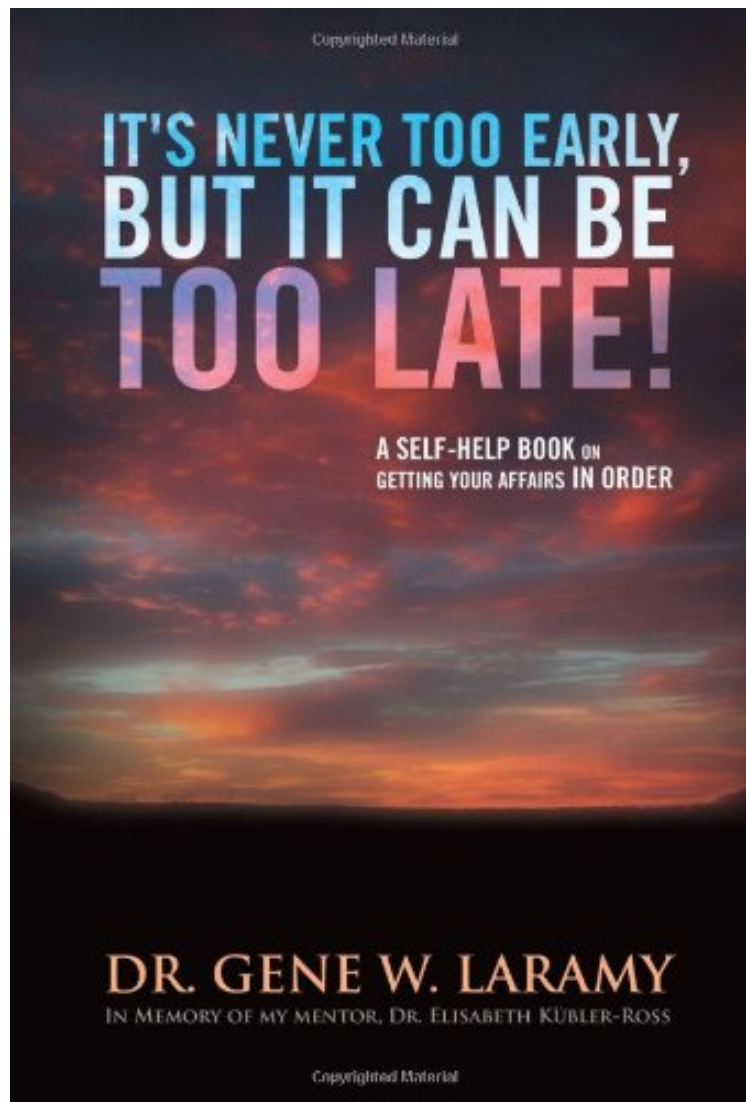


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## It's Never Too Early, But It Can Be Too Late! - A self-help book on getting your affairs in order
