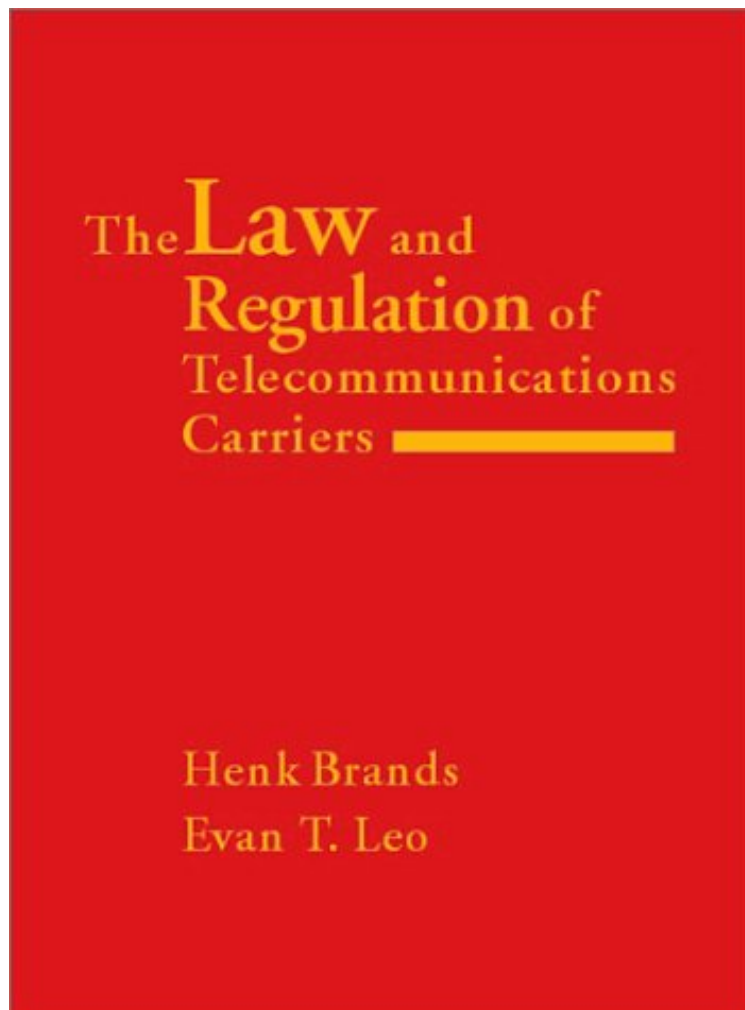

The material presented is both interesting and helpful in understanding the law and regulation of telecommunications carriers.
