By Karen Kelly I passed the Professional Responsibility exam (MPRE) in San Francisco, CA by using just the free study guides provided by the folk who give the exam (National Conference of Bar Examiners). I first started to listen to this course, and found it too overwhelming with info, and not presented in a simple, friendly way. It was more like someone was reading a dictionary to me, if you know what I mean. If you're looking to get it to help you pass the exam, I suggest you don't need it. The exam is not that difficult. Just study the ABAs Annotated Model Rules of Professional Conduct, and you'll be fine. I think sometimes professors and colleges want to make subjects seem uber complicated. This bit of law is not worthy of an entire college course, in my opinion. This little exam is nothing like studying for the bar exam. It's an exam on one little section of law. And it seems like there are all of these entities that want to convince you it's so complicated, you need a ton of study materials, etc., etc. I disagree with that. The NCBE offers online practice exams, too (ncbex.org), if

you study better that way. I didn't do that, and still passed with a high enough score for CA. I went ahead and took the exam before my 3rd year of law school, and passed, before taking this course through my law school. It was just more convenient for me. So, if you're good at studying info, then taking an exam, you'll be fine without this lecture. You'll even be fine passing the exam before even taking the course through your school. And I think listening to this course will make you think it's all more complicated than it really is. Normally I love this series. But, not this one. 5 of 5 people found the following review helpful. Better off just reading the rules. By mustarseed2007 This is just the prof reading rules to you and very rarely giving examples on application of the rule to a hypo. Occasionally he gives tips on what are common MPRE questions, but nothing earth shattering (conflicts is a big part of the exam...shhhh don't tell!!). Plus, the rules have been revised a little bit since these tapes and they are no longer completely correct (example: the rule about permissive breaking of client confidences has changed). Even if a more recent set of tapes by this guy is available, I'd really think twice. He really doesn't give you any more insight into what's on the MPRE than the rules themselves and I don't think it's gonna help you much in a PR class unless your class is very very very basic and black letter oriented.
