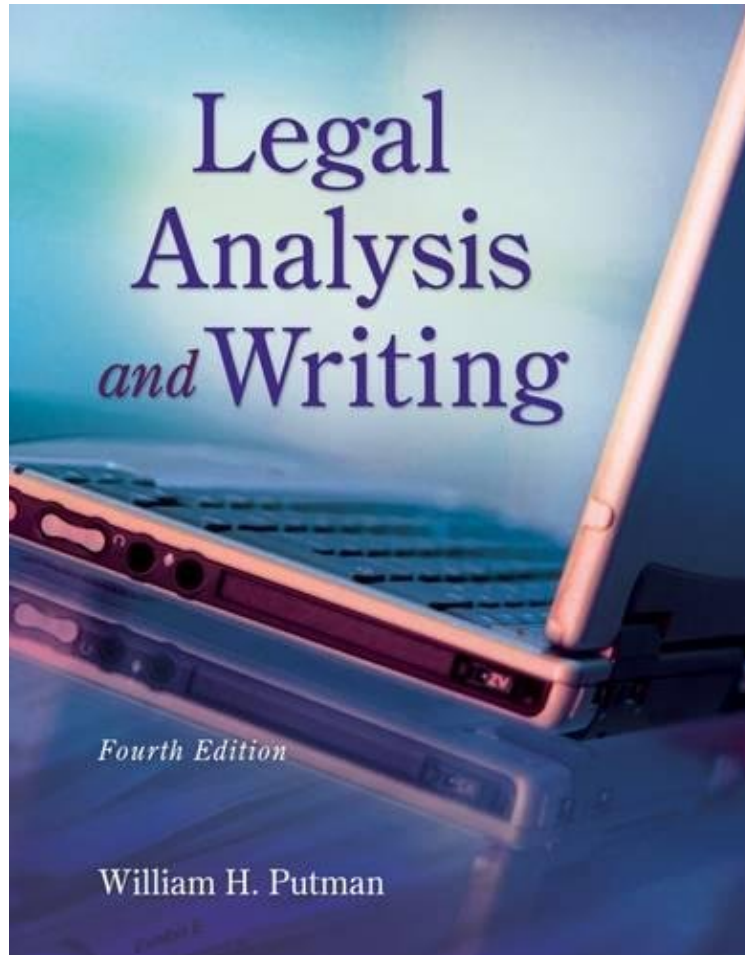

It starts out with Part 1 refreshing your memory of what you learned in high school civics, which is necessary to understand if you want to work as a paralegal. Part 2 moves onto The Specifics of Legal Analysis-in 7 important chapters, covering statutory analysis, case law and case briefing, key facts, issue identification, state the issue, case law application and counteranalysis. Part 3 moves into Legal Writing in 6 chapters, covering effective legal writing skills, fundamentals of writing, memorandum assignments on issues and facts, analysis to conclusions, court briefs, and general correspondence. The appendix has 4 great reference parts that

really help you put it all together. This is a very well written book.
