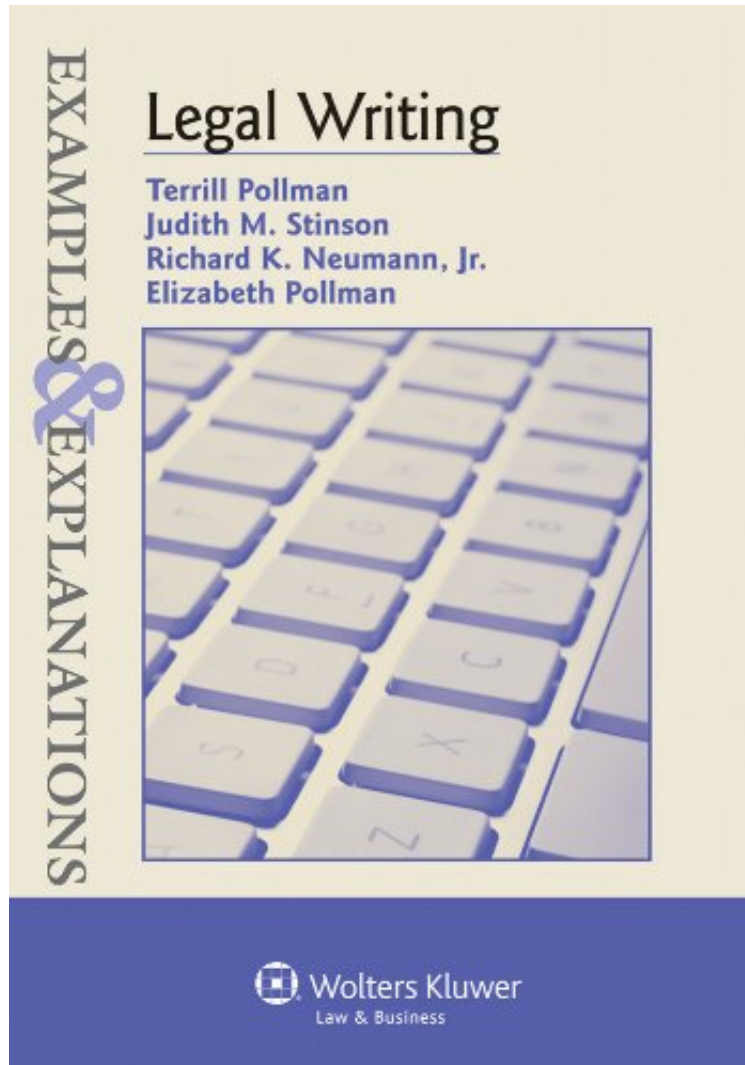

A new addition to the popular Examples Explanations Series, *Legal Writing* uses a methodology based on the EE pedagogy to teach students how to analyze and assess the effectiveness of their writing. Students decide whether the writing excerpts in the examples meet certain criteria for effectiveness. The authors then explain why the example succeeds or fails to meet those criteria. *Legal Writing: Examples Explanations* is designed to accompany any legal writing text. Focusing on core writing skills, *Legal Writing, Examples Explanations* features: examples that focus on each part of the memo or brief; several examples for each part; because there are many ways to write well or badly questions after each example that ask whether the writing sample satisfies certain criteria for effective writing; detailed explanations for why the example does or does not meet those criteria; pedagogically consistent chapter organization; what you need to know about the skill under discussion; a step-by-step "how to" section; examples explanations; two case files; the facts and authority located in the appendices; that form the basis for most of the example; straightforward, conversational writing style
