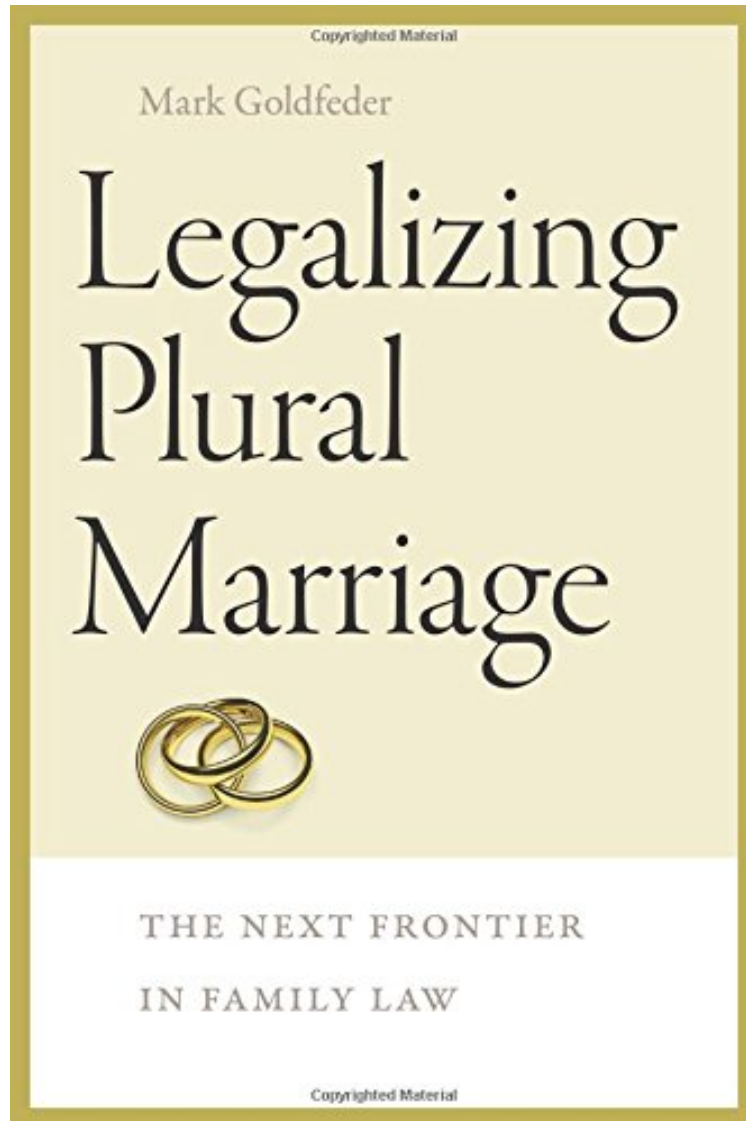

Although Mark Goldfeder does not argue the right or wrong of plural marriage, he maintains that polygamy is the next step after same-sex marriage in the development of U.S. family law. Providing a road map to show how such legalization could be handled, he explores the legislative and administrative arguments which demonstrate that plural marriage is not as far fetched or as far off as we might think. Goldfeder argues not only that polygamy is in keeping with the legislative values and freedoms of the United States, but also that it would not be difficult to manage or administer within our current legal system.
