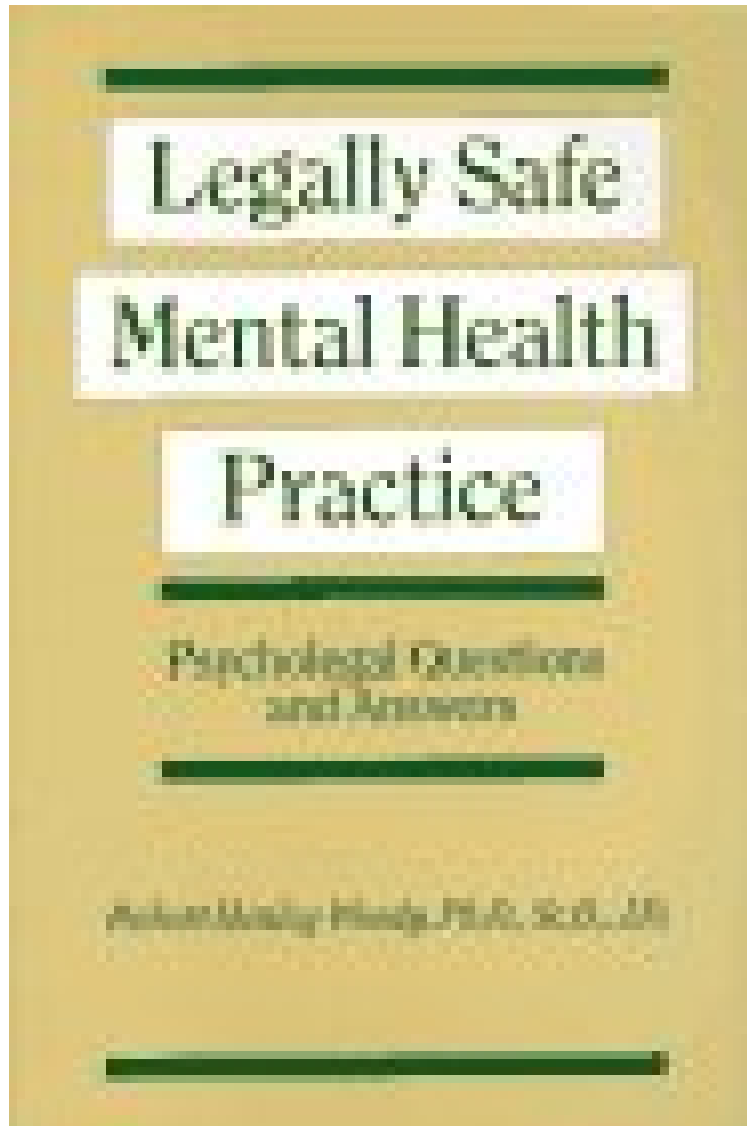

advice on the spectrum of potential problem areas including, record-keeping, dual relationships, the standard of care, etc. What makes his book unique amongst the many (relatively) in this field is his common sense approach and verbiage.
